The **Relocalization Network** is a key initiative of **Post Carbon Institute**. The Network is composed of over 100 groups that are working to develop and implement the strategy of relocalization in their communities.

Relocalization is a strategy to eliminate dependence on big industrial energy sources by reducing consumption and rebuilding societies based on the local production of food and energy, and the development of local currency, governance and culture. The relocalization strategy developed in response to the environmental, social, political and economic impacts of global over-reliance on cheap energy. Our dependence on cheap non-renewable fossil fuel energy has produced climate change, the erosion of community, and the instability of the global economic system.

Local groups work in their communities on projects such as cooperative transport and food networks, local renewable energy production, community assessment inventories and municipal action plans in order to prepare at the community level for an energy constrained future.

The **Relocalization Network** facilitates the sharing of resources, best practices, and experiences between groups and provides an opportunity for groups to network with each other. In order to support groups, the Relocalization Network initiative provides on-line communication tools, develops valuable resources, facilitates connections between groups and cultivates a sense of working together globally on local responses.
